CANCER CARE AT RVH

The Hudson Regional Cancer Centre (HRCC) at RVH cares for our neighbours, loved ones and friends living with cancer in Simcoe Muskoka. Last year, more than 14,000 patients accessed cancer care close to home at RVH.

The people we care for come from across the region to receive treatment at RVH, totaling almost 120,000 visits to the centre each year. More than three quarters of our patients live outside of Barrie and are able to receive this world-class, specialized care without having to travel to the GTA.

We currently have 34 chemotherapy treatment spaces, complete with a satellite pharmacy and a state-of-theart RIVA chemotherapy preparation robot, three radiation machines, one PET-CT and one CT simulator suite to plan treatments and two large outpatient clinics.

The expansion of our regional cancer program will significantly contribute to helping achieve our goal of providing every level of cancer treatment. Whether it's developing complex malignant hematology and stem cell transplant care, participating in cutting-edge clinical trials, or bringing stateof-the-art stereotactic radiotherapy and radiosurgery to RVH, we strive to bring leading-edge care closer to home for our patients and to keep our region at its healthiest."

WHY WE NEED TO GROW

Since opening in 2012, the number of patients relying on the HRCC has increased two-fold. While we have achieved many milestones in the last decade, a number of the major equipment pieces used every day for patient care are now ten years old. Most of these pieces only have a few years of life left.

In the next 20 years, the population of Simcoe Muskoka is expected to double. By the time that happens, one in three of us will be a senior. According to the Canadian Cancer Registry, getting older is the most important risk factor for most cancers. In 2018, fewer than two percent of all cancers were diagnosed among people under age 30, whereas more than 70 percent were diagnosed among those aged 60 and older. We can reasonably expect that without an expansion, our regional cancer centre will not be equipped to handle this significant increase in demand.



OUR VISION FOR YOUR CARE

Our vision for the future is to provide personalized, minimally invasive treatments, in state of the art-spaces, for cancers that we can detect before they threaten a life so that our patients can get back to living a healthy life as soon as possible.

Our priority initiatives for the expansion of our cancer care include:

- More advanced imaging for more precise and faster diagnosis and treatment
 - An additional MRI for detailed imaging



- An MRI simulator for advanced external beam radiation and brachytherapy planning
- + New minimally invasive treatments
 - High dose brachytherapy, which places radiation directly into or next to a tumour, to treat gynecological and prostate cancers
- + Treatments and personalized care for more types of cancer
 - Precision ablative radiation to treat many kinds of cancers, including liver and spinal cancers
 - Full scope of care for patients with leukemia and related blood cancers
- + Expanded chemotherapy and radiation suites for all the types cancer we treat
 - More beds and care spaces, including exam rooms, consultation rooms and recovery bays
- + New Lara Hudson Cancer Clinics in Innisfil
 - Systemic and supportive cancer treatment
 - Outpatient clinics
 - Psychosocial support for patients
